Service Descriptions

As we strive to create an ever more inviting, welcoming space for worship, we will continue to provide two distinct main service options. For the first day of Rosh Hashana and all of Yom Kippur, we will offer:

“Sanctuary Service”

(The service usually held in the Sanctuary, last year held in the BHS Auditorium)

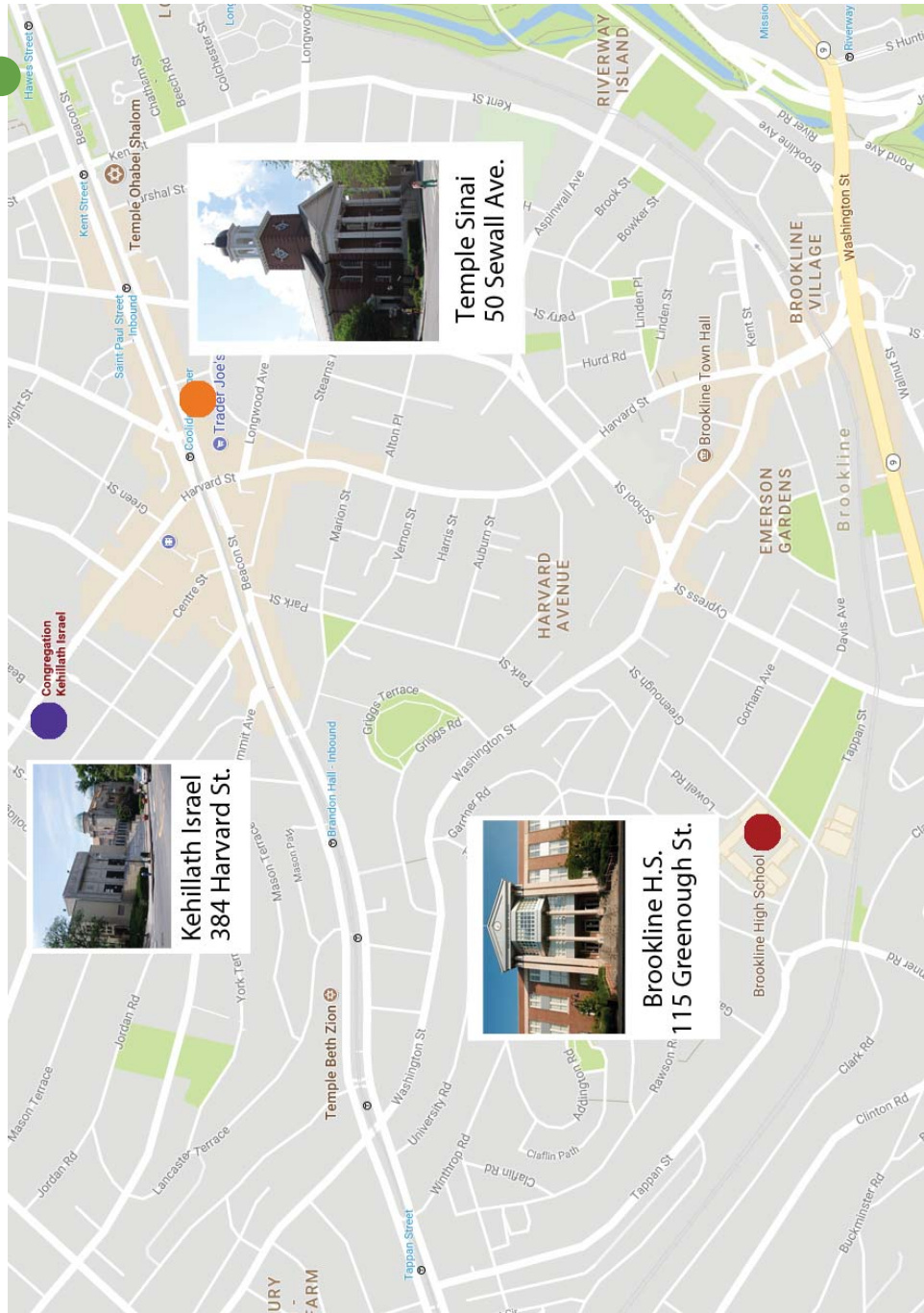

“Epstein Service”

(The service originally held in Epstein, last year held in the BHS gymnasium)

On the second day of Rosh Hashana, we will all join together for a single, soulful experience led together by Rabbi Hamilton, Hazzan Wachs, and lay leaders.
